This course provides the knowledge and analytic tools for a broad understanding and appreciation of the diverse experiences of Asian American groups. In particular, it focuses on their histories, community and family life, strategies for economic and cultural survival and adaptation, and social and political responses to racism. All of this will be done within the context of global and U.S. history and the experiences of other peoples of color. Course materials are very readable and include articles, documents, oral histories, and an award-winning textbook. Lectures and discussions will be supplemented with classroom exercises, films, and guest speakers. There will be opportunities to study local Asian communities and summer festivals.

This class has been scheduled in the late afternoon for the convenience of students who will have jobs or other classes earlier in the day. For those who are interested, the course meets one of the requirements for a minor in ethnic studies and also for the new major in ethnic studies. The instructor has been teaching and doing research in Asian American studies at UCD and other universities for several decades and consistently receives excellent course evaluations.
