## Colorado School of Public Health

The University of Colorado Denver invites applications and nominations for the position of Dean of the Colorado School of Public Health (CSPH). The dean is the chief administrative and fiscal officer of the school as well as its principal spokesperson to academic and public health education communities, students, and alumni. We are seeking an energetic and dynamic leader to bring the school to even greater prominence locally, nationally, and internationally.

Established in 2008 and accredited in 2010, the Colorado School of Public Health is a Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH) accredited collaborative school, comprised of three partners: The University of Colorado Denver (as the lead institution), Colorado State University, and the University of Northern Colorado. The CSPH enrolls nearly 400 graduate students in 15 public health academic and professional programs. There are 192 projects funded for \$19.4 million and over 150 core and clinical faculty.

The University of Colorado Denver is an urban research university serving more than 28,000 students in Aurora, Denver, and online awarding more than 4,000 degrees each year, from 132 highly rated degree programs from 13 schools and colleges. The University of Colorado Denver currently has more than \$400 million in research awards each year. A wide array of health-related programs and facilities are offered at our Anschutz Medical Campus, while a significant number of undergraduate and graduate degree programs are taught at our comprehensive campus in the heart of downtown Denver.

The Dean of the Colorado School of Public Health is a key member of the University of Colorado Denver's leadership team, serving as a strategist, advocate, leader, and effective spokesperson for academic and student concerns as well as other matters related to the well-being of the collaborative school. The new dean will chart a path and provide vision and guidance in all aspects of the school's educational programs, research endeavors, and community outreach and service programs. S/he needs to recruit and retain a diverse pool of excellent faculty, enhance the program of funded research, and continuously improve the teaching and learning environment for students. The new dean also will be expected to continue to encourage effective collaborative relationships within the school, with the partner institutions, and among University of Colorado Denver schools/colleges and programs, especially those on the Anschutz Medical Campus where the administrative home of the School resides. The dean is expected to interact effectively with Colorado public health agencies and external advisory groups in promoting all aspects of the school.
