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TEACHING RECORD at UCD Anschutz Curriculums Created at UCD

CBHS 6642 (formally 6670): Applied Program Evaluation—Field School

This course began Fall 2013 and is a 2 semester course. Students in this course work with a community agency that has evaluation needs. The class determines the design, creates the data collection tools, collects that data, analyzes the data, and prepares a dissemination report. The goal of the course is to provide an in-depth evaluation experience for students while helping those in the community. To enhance the experience, a minimum of 3 evaluators act as an advisory board for the project and meet with the students in the middle of each phase to provide insight and advice. The class includes dyadic discussion, readings from an evaluation textbooks and articles that fit with the problem/goal of the community agency, and hands-on experience. Starting in 2015 clients began paying \$5000 to work with the class. This has offset the cost of offering the class to a smaller number of students on a yearly basis.

CBHS 6612 – Methods in Research and Evaluation

I have been teaching the course since Fall of 2010. I have worked with my co-instructor to make changes to the course and course material to better meet the level of the students in the class and to increase the course content applicability. During my tenure with this course I have brought in more outside guest lecturers (and worked with them prior to the lecture), created tools and lab experiences to help students grasp the scope of the evaluation early on so they can plan for the projects, and created numerous in-class exercises. I also deliver a majority of the lectures. In the Fall of 2016 Dr. Risnedal and I co-taught this course as an online course. This required some major changes to how guests were included and how what were typically in-class assignments were delivered to the online group.

Conducting Clinical Trials for Investigators

This is a 2 credit hour summer course for students in the Clinical Sciences track. Students learn about the nuts and bolts of conducting a clinical trial including Good Clinical Practice. In class they are asked to design a trial; their papers include thinking through staffing, budgeting, creating recruitment and consent materials. For the final paper students are asked to read a classmates protocol and provide feedback. I taught this course for 4 years and have since passed it onto to another instructor. I worked with the new instructor on the intent, purpose, and structure of the course.

Writing at Lower Reading Levels

I received a diversity grant from UCDHSC and created a course to teach Principal Investigators and Coordinators how to write recruitment and consent materials at lower reading levels. When the grant ended, I was able to secure funding from COMIRB to continue with the 2 hour course as well as conduct labs and offer one-on-one assistance for anyone referred by COMIRB. This course became part of CTTIC when it started.
