B. Seminar with ISP students: (1 hour each)

C. Global Health Lecture Series (Through CU Center for Global Health): (10 hours minimum)

D. Global Health Project (up to 50 hours): Includes written report and presentation (poster or seminar)

E. Global Health Symposium (20 hours per symposium): This is an annual conference sponsored by the Center for Global Health

F. Participation in Global Health SAC (Student Academic Community) activities (minimum 10 hours)

G. Participation in mission trip abroad (as they become available) (40 hours)

H. Abstract research articles in Global Oral Health (worth 1 hour each)

I. Perspectives in International Health (PUBH 6619) through the Colorado School of Public Health (2.0 Credit Hours – 20 hours)

J. Attend quarterly meetings/seminars with faculty mentors (6 hours)
