A. Personal Statement

Patients with multiple chronic conditions utilize a high percentage of healthcare resources and often have poor outcomes and suffer from poor quality of life. Further, they offer unique challenges for primary care physicians. My primary research interest is in the care of complex medical patients in primary care, with a specific focus on the role of mental illness in the primary care setting. I am actively engaged in qualitative work exploring the experiences of primary care physicians in treating these patients. I am interested in using this qualitative work to better understand patient complexity from the perspective of primary care physicians. With a better understanding of patient complexity I plan to study an intervention to help primary care physician care for their complex medical patient, especially those with mental illness. I am also using quantitative analysis to better define the role of mental illness in complex medical patients. I am involved in observational quantitative research using the Medical Expenditures Panel Survey to study the effects of treatment for depression in patients with both depression and diabetes on both medical expenditures and mental and physical functioning status. Prior work with resident physicians on communication around the challenging topic of sexual history-taking and ongoing training in primary care research as a University of Colorado HRSA Primary Care Fellow have prepared me for my current work with physicians and their experiences with complex patients.
