José R. Romero, MD

Professor of Pediatrics – Infectious Disease

Dr. Romero earned his medical degree from the Universidad Autónoma de Guadalajara in Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico. After pediatric residency and a Chief Resident year at the University Hospital at SUNY Stony Brook, he completed multiple fellowships including a fellowship in Pediatric Infectious Disease at the University of Colorado SOM. He was also a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's Minority Medical Faculty Development Program Fellow.

Dr. Romero has a productive career in research, clinical infectious disease, and public health. His research interests include molecular pathogenesis, epidemiology, and enteroviruses and other viral pathogens. He is actively involved in NIH and industry sponsored antiviral, antibiotic, antifungal, vaccine and clinical therapeutic/diagnostic trials. He was a former policy adviser to President Vicente Fox (Mexico). Currently, Dr. Romero is a Professor of Pediatrics and the Horace C. Cabe Endowed Chair in Pediatric Infectious Diseases at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Arkansas Children's Hospital. He also serves as the Director of Clinical Trials Research at Arkansas Research Institute and the Pediatric Tuberculosis Physician for the Arkansas Department of Health. He is the incoming Chairman for the CDC Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP).
