We at the University of Colorado Denver College of Nursing celebrated our Centennial Year in 1998. We have a rich history of innovations in shaping important milestones in the nursing profession to share with you. For example, we are known for the advancement of nursing as the art and science of human caring and as the birthplace of the nurse practitioner movement, and have made significant contributions in the areas of school-based health care and nursing informatics. The College of Nursing has many excellent academic programs. In addition to our BS and Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Program, we are known for our pioneering and ongoing efforts in distance education, particularly in the MS and PhD Programs that enable us to attract students from rural, regional, and national arenas. Approximately 780 students are enrolled in these four programs with relatively even distribution between the undergraduate program (BSN) and the three graduate programs (MS, DNP, PhD). There are over 80 regular full and part-time faculty, in addition to clinical colleagues throughout the state who serve as clinical scholars and preceptors for student practicums.

As the College of Nursing moves forward as one of the leading schools in this nation in the 21st Century, we will continue this important and historical trend. Our faculty and students partner with communities in creating insightful educational innovations, uses of technology, and creative curricula to address health care needs in today's challenging and evolving health care system. We are committed to creating an environment that shifts from the traditional faculty-student relationship to one in which the student is a partner-colleague in the teaching/learning process.

We have strong faculty practices for care across the lifespan - adult, pediatrics, midwifery, psychiatric/ mental health, and family health. The OREA also assists faculty and students with meeting the requirements of the Colorado Multiple Institute Review Board (COMIRB), implementing the UCD policies on Conflict of Interest, and assuring adherence to the UCD research grant and contract policies.

The University of Colorado Denver College of Nursing has an atmosphere that is student friendly and future-oriented. A prospective student joins a community of distinguished faculty and student scholars in which students have a major role in shaping their personal futures, the future of the nursing, and the College.
