Preparing to apply for admission

Once you are ready to apply, have the following important information on hand as you complete your paper or online application:

- » your social security number (disclosure is optional, but recommended for those applying for financial aid and/or the Colorado Opportunity fund). You will be assigned a student identification number once we receive your application.
- » names, addresses and zip codes of all high schools and colleges or universities attended, along with dates of attendance at each
- » if applying to college for the first time, you will be asked to list high school courses completed or in progress
 - have a copy of your high school transcript or all of your report cards and your schedule on hand
- » if under age 23 and claiming Colorado residency for tuition purposes, you will need the following information (if applicable) for yourself and for your parent or guardian who is a Colorado resident:
 - dates of continuous physical presence (residence) in Colorado
 - dates of extended absences if applicable
 - date of issue of Colorado Drivers licenses and motor vehicle registrations
 - date of purchase of Colorado residential property (as a primary residence)
 - date of Colorado voter registration
 - dates of employment and name of the most recent employer.

To avoid delays in processing your application, be sure you have submitted or requested the following fees and documents:

- \$50.00 application fee
- official high school transcripts (for freshmen and transfer students with fewer than 30 semester credits)
- official final high school transcript listing date of graduation (when available)
- ACT or SAT scores if not posted on your high school transcripts (for freshmen and transfer students with fewer than 13 semester credits)
- official college or university transcripts from *each* institution you have attended
- final official college or university transcripts if you are presently enrolled in courses
- essay/personal statement, recommended but not required
- a copy of your permanent resident card, if applicable
- other information or document(s) if requested from the Office of Admissions
- additional music application requirements, if applying to the department of music
