

Postsecondary Enrollment Options Application Instructions

High School juniors and seniors may apply to the University of Colorado Denver Downtown Denver Campus to enroll in courses, which substitute for courses required for high school graduation. Courses taken at UCD will appear on a University of Colorado transcript and may affect the student's eligibility for admissions to a degree program at the University of Colorado or other collegiate institutions. If admitted, credit for courses successfully completed may be applied toward an undergraduate degree. **Addendum: The College Opportunity Fund (COF) stipend beginning fall 2006 semester will offer a reduced tuition rate to PSEO students. All required materials must be received 45 days prior to the first day of classes of the term the student is seeking to attend. The deadlines for upcoming semesters are:

Spring 2010: November 20, 2009 Fall 2010: April 30, 2010

Postsecondary Enrollment Options applicants must submit the following materials:

1. Postsecondary Enrollment Options application form.
2. Unofficial high school transcript
3. SAT or ACT scores (if available)
4. \$25 non-refundable application fee (**not required if previously attended**).

If you plan to continue another semester, these forms are required:

1. Completed Parent/High School/District Authorization Form
2. Statewide Agreement Form

Notes: Postsecondary Enrollment Options students are accepted for ***one term*** at a time. A student wishing to enroll for courses at UCD in subsequent semesters must submit a new Parent/High School/District Authorization Form and a Statewide Agreement Form each semester. The application fee and transcript requirements will be waived after the first semester.

Students will be required to obtain academic advising prior to registration for class(es) from the PSEO Coordinator. Postsecondary Options students will be invited to an orientation prior to the beginning of the semester. Topics of discussion include, student advising, tutoring services; student ID's; bookstore, library, classroom location, registration/payment deadlines and procedures.

Students will be dropped from the system, if prior arrangements are not made with the Bursar's Office to pay tuition and fees by the published deadline.

***The Extended Studies classes are not to be taken by students participating in the Post Secondary Enrollment Options Act Program.**
