Milking 2-3x/day






Dairy Workforce

•77,000 immigrants (51%) worked on dairy farms in 2014

- •number of immigrants working on dairy farms rose by 35% in six years
- •Workers from Mexico, Central and South America
 - 85%+ Hispanic
- Low education level
 - 7% no education
 - 38% primary/elementary school
 - 18% middle school
 - 30% high school

Occupational Health Research Challenges

Setting

- Place of business (family legacy and home), not laboratory
 - Owner asks questions:
- 1) What risk am I exposing myself (business) to?
- 2) How do I (or industry) benefit from this?
- 3) Will this disrupt any operations?
- 4) How will data be used?

- Remote locations (travel)
- Language barriers
- Distrust among workers
- Work schedules
- Farm variability
- Research equipment technical challenges

Our Approach

<u>LISTEN</u> to dairy stakeholders, and <u>RESPOND</u> to needs and concerns with sound and relevant research and outreach efforts.

Our Story: Research

Respiratory

- Occupational Lung Disease and Bioaerosol/Endotoxin Exposure
 - Improved methods for inhalable sampling, endotoxin analysis (rFC, GC/MSMS), microbiome – metagenomics and Antimicrobial Resistance
 - Newer workers more susceptible to inflammatory lung disease
 - Control mechanisms for dust (washing milking parlor, bedding materials) evaluated



Our Story: Research

Musculoskeletal Symptoms Among Dairy Parlor Workers

- •Symptom Survey
 - 4 year study32 dairies in 5 states
 - •N=452
- 89% male
- 97% Hispanic
- 85% kicked by cow

•Job related pain:

- 47% feet
- 42% upper back
- 40% shoulder
- 36% wrist
- 29% low back
- 25% neck
- 24% knee
- 19% elbow
- 19% hip







Ergonomics

•Exposure Assessment and Intervention Analysis in Large-Herd Dairy Parlors

- Full shift (8-12 hrs) direct measurement of physical exposures (muscle forces, posture, repetition, physiological load)
- Comparison of parlor configurations
- Intervention analysis
 - Milking equipment and tools






