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
Background

25% of Occupational Fatalities




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Objectives



270 Participants




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Top Winter Driving Hazards



Top Summer Driving Hazards




















Percent reporting "sometimes" or "often"

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

Recommendations

- Public Education about trucks.
 - Overhead sign messages
 - Directing flyers towards the public
 - Incorporating it in driver training curriculum
- 2. Re-evaluate hours of service rules. Combat unrealistic delivery deadlines.
 - * 15-30% trips violation-inducing for length, loads and schedule (Beilock ,1995)
- 3. Wage policies and turnover issues.
- 4. More & ongoing training for drivers.
