*A Day with Brad Johnson*

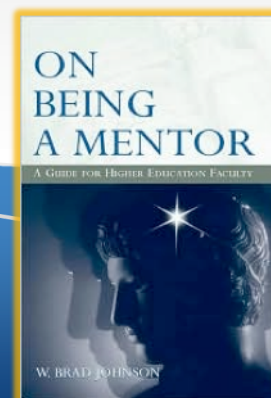

Dr. Johnson has authored more than 75 articles and book chapters and 5 books in the area of ethical behaviors, mentoring and counseling.
