Assessment 101 and Beyond: Identifying, Understanding and Applying Outcomes Assessment in Experiential Learning

This workshop will introduce beginners to the fundamentals of assessment in experiential learning settings and provide intermediate level assessment training for practitioners beyond the beginner's level, who seek to improve their outcomes assessment skills. The primary goal is to assist participants in the development of an outcomes assessment plan to use at their own institution. Employing a hands-on, active learning approach, this workshop will include a mix of presentation, applied tasks, small group work, and interactive discussion. **(Track 1)**

Experiential Education Beyond the Basics: Student, Staff and Faculty Issues in Experiential Education

This interactive workshop, geared towards intermediate and advanced level practitioners, considers student, staff and faculty issues in internships, service-learning and course practica. Internship issues are discussed within the framework of the developmental levels of internship (Sweitzer & King). Included as well are discussions about seminar/colloquia classes, reflection as a tool of learning and assessment tools. **(Track 2)**

Legal Issues of Internships and Experiential Learning

Chris Puckett, University of Colorado Denver

This workshop examines the broad range of legal issues that arise in administering experiential learning programs, with particular emphasis on the reciprocal rights and responsibilities of the school, work-site, and student. Key issues such as student, school and work-site liability, risk management (including waivers, assumption of risk and insurance), protecting and accommodating student rights (including discrimination and ADA compliance), tax and compensation consideration, contractual obligations, and issues arising out of the use of public funds, will be examined. Time will be allotted for participants to engage in a discussion of these issues, as well as explore the application of legal issues to their specific programs in a "legal clinic" format.

SPEAKER Bios

Chris Puckett joined the Office of University Counsel as Assistant University Counsel in August of 2009. Mr. Puckett previously served as Assistant Attorney General in the Employment Personnel and Civil Rights units of the Colorado Attorney General's Office. Mr. Puckett received his undergraduate degree from the University of Denver, where he was an honors graduate. In 2004, he received his juris doctorate from Georgetown University Law Center in Washington, D.C., where he served as Senior Editor of the Georgetown Journal on Poverty Law & Policy.

Lynne Montrose is the Director of the Academic Internship Program at Regis University in Denver, Colorado. Involved primarily in internships since 1982, she launched the Regis Center for Service-Learning in 1987, directed the Office of Study Abroad in the 90s, where she created its Irish Exchange Program and initiated the Northern Ireland Scholars Program. She is actively involved with the Leadership Program and INROADS (internships for minorities). Lynne was a prior member of the NSEE Board of Directors.

Jim Walters has an undergraduate degree in English Literature from The George Washington University and a Masters Degree in theatre from the Catholic University of America. He has worked with the Kettering Foundation on initiatives regarding deliberation and its application to public democracy. Jim is currently Director of Student Life at Montgomery College with programs that are based on a Social Change Model of Leadership Development and he is a certified instructor of the PTK Leadership program. He currently serves on the NSEE Board Directors.
