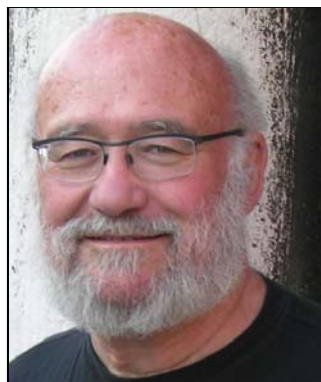


## The Changing Roles of Faculty: Scholarship, Rewards, and Responsibilities

R. Eugene Rice is Senior Scholar at the Association of American Colleges and Universities and holds an appointment in the new Ph.D. Program in Leadership and Change for senior professionals at Antioch University. For ten years he served as Director of the Forum on Faculty Roles and Rewards and the New Pathways projects at the American Association for Higher Education. He was previously a Senior Fellow at the Carnegie Foundation, engaging in studies of the scholarly priorities of the American professoriate. His collaboration with the late Ernest Boyer on *Scholarship Reconsidered* has been highly influential.

In *Change* magazine's survey of leadership in American higher education, Gene Rice is recognized as one of a small group of "idea leaders" whose work has made a difference nationally. Rice currently is working on faculty initiatives with potential for improving developing countries torn by violent civil conflict. A recent publication on early-career faculty is entitled "Heeding New Voices: Academic Careers for a New Generation" (with Mary Deanne Sorcinelli and Ann Austin.)

Rice and Sorcinelli also have a chapter "Improving the Tenure Process" appearing in a book published recently by Harvard Press.

He is a graduate of Harvard Divinity School and received his Ph.D. from Harvard University.

### **Expectations for the symposium:**

- Opportunity to discuss important issues related to the faculty reward system with key university leaders and faculty colleagues
- Opportunity to interact and discuss with Dr. Rice his ideas on alternate modes of scholarship including:
  1. Scholarship of Teaching
  2. Scholarship of Integration
  3. Scholarship of Discovery
  4. Scholarship of Engagement
- Opportunity to suggest future steps in UC Denver's internal discussions focusing on the faculty reward system

### **2008 Symposium Evaluation Results**

Following the symposium a survey was conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of this year's Undergraduate Symposium and future symposia. Seventy-one faculty members attended the symposium, observed a panel discussion from CU administrators, a keynote address by Dr. Rice and participated in facilitated discussions regarding the four forms of scholarship. All attendees were asked to complete an electronic evaluation following the symposium; 34 individuals responded. The following pages report evaluation findings.
