	IRC Professional Development Grant	Provides professional development support to all IRC Faculty. This includes lecturers, senior instructors, and clinical teaching track faculty. Applicants are encouraged to propose ideas that go beyond these examples. Open Educational Resources Grant (Individual)	Provides resources for an individual faculty who wish to adopt, adapt, or create open educational resources in a course. Priority is given to courses with high enrollment, core courses, and/or prerequisite courses. Open Educational Resources Grant (Series)	Provides resources for 2-3 faculty within a department who wish to adopt, adapt, or create OER for a series of courses.	Sample activities can include: adopting an OER textbook to be used across several sections of a core course, adapting OER that can replace existing materials in a series of required courses within a major, developing a suite of course materials that instructors can pull from among several sections of a core course. ffice of Research Services	Arts and Humanities Seed Grants Program	Provides support to Arts and Humanities Faculty who are seeking external funding in the form of grants, contracts, and fellowship. Specifically, to support the preparation of a proposal for external funding or the creation of artistic works or preliminary research in the humanities necessary to the preparation of an external funding application.	Funds may be used to support the preparation of a proposal for external funding or the creation of artistic work or preliminary research in the humanities necessary to the preparation of an external funding application. Funds are not intended to support specific projects or professional development needs. These seed grants are intended to launch research or creative work as well as advance existing activities and investigations in an effort to strengthen applications to external funding agencies or foundations. The purpose is to support researchers and creative activities specific to the Arts and Humanities. 	Grand Challenges Grant Program	Provides support for planning, team formation, and proposal development around "high impact" research and creative work. 	Open/All Disciplines Seed Grants Program	Provides support for faculty proposal development efforts that seek external funding for traditional research activities, but that require small amounts of funding to launch initial research activities providing the initial data, archival material, and community engagement necessary to complete an external grant application.	Funds may be used to support the preparation of an external funding proposal or development of preliminary research necessary to the preparation of an external funding application. Funds are not intended to support specific projects or professional development needs such as conference travel or publication costs. These seed grants are intended to launch research, scholarly activities, or creative activities as well as advance existing activities and investigations in an effort to strengthen applications to external funding agencies or private foundations.
