

MASTER'S STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP Nomination Form:

All CU Denver Colleges can apply for Master's student Scholarships.

- International students: \$5000 per year in each of the first two years
- Domestic out-of-state students: \$7000 in the first year only (though WICHE students will be treated as domestic in-state financially, but by out-of-state review criteria)
- Domestic in-state students: \$2500 per year for the first two years

It is expected that these offers will be made only to highly competitive students who might not enroll at CU Denver without such incentive. Their scholarship qualification might be reflected in a high undergraduate GPA (e.g. 3.8+ in-state, 3.5+ out-of-state), though this could be variable with different undergraduate institutions, and other factors that make a student especially competitive will be considered as well. Reviewers will also take into account the programs' needs for increased recruiting to achieve optimum enrollment. All Master's Programs can earn up to three fellowships per calendar year and can resend a new nomination if an awardee declines the offer.
