- Avoid dropping or withdrawing from classes without checking how it affects your aid

- Apply every academic year — financial aid does not automatically renew
- Early applications help maximize your chances for financial aid.
- Priority Deadline at CU Denver is March 1, 2026
- Contact the Financial Aid Office early if you face financial hardship

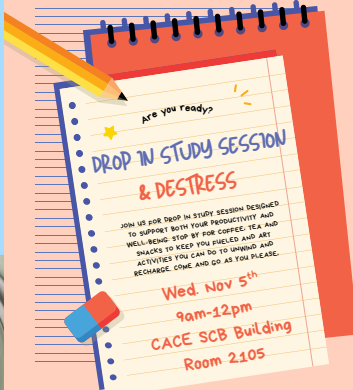
