

ARROZ CON LECHE (RICE PUDDIN

A SWEET AND CREAMY DESSERT THAT BRINGS COMFORT TO MANY HISPANIC HOUSEHOLDS. PERFECT FOR HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH!

NGREDIENTS

- 1 CUP LONG-GRAIN WHITE RICE
- 4 CUPS WHOLE MILK (OR 2% IF PREFERRED)
 - 1 CUP WATER
- 1 CINNAMON STICK (OR 1 TSP GROUND CINNAMON)
- 1 CUP SWEETENED CONDENSED MILK
- ½ CUP SUGAR (ADJUST TO TASTE)
- 1 TSP VANILLA EXTRACT
- GROUND CINNAMON (FOR GARNISH)

INSTRUCTIONS

COOK THE RICE: IN A MEDIUM SAUCEPAN, ADD RICE, WATER, AND CINNAMON STICK. COOK OVER MEDIUM HEAT UNTIL THE RICE IS TENDER AND WATER IS ABSORBED (ABOUT 10-12 MINUTES).

ADD THE MILK MIXTURE: STIR IN THE MILK, CONDENSED MILK, AND SUGAR. COOK ON LOW HEAT, STIRRING OFTEN SO IT DOESN'T STICK, FOR 20-25 MINUTES UNTIL THICK AND CREAMY.

- FLAVOR IT: REMOVE THE CINNAMON STICK. STIR IN VANILLA EXTRACT.
- SERVE: SERVE WARM OR CHILLED IN SMALL BOWLS.
 SPRINKLE WITH GROUND CINNAMON ON TOP BEFORE SERVING.




