THIRD YEAR

MPAS 6905 Surgery

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez, PA-C

This course involves student participation as a member of a surgical team in a teaching hospital. Students will learn clinical skills for pre-operative, intra-operative and post-operative surgical medicine. This will include history taking, physical diagnosis, assessment and patient management. Students will observe or participate in surgical procedures under the supervision of community clinical preceptors.

MPAS 6913 Pediatric Critical & Acute Care

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez, PA-C

This course involves active participation as a member of the critical and acute care or inpatient team in a pediatric teaching hospital. Restricted to CHA/PA students. Students must complete application process and be accepted before enrollment.

MPAS 6920 Neonatology

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This course involves active participation in the care of neonates in a teaching hospital. Attendance at morning rounds, making case presentations and participating in the night and weekend call schedule are required. Students are encouraged to attend deliveries and perform circumcision and other procedures with appropriate supervision.

MPAS 6930 Ambulatory Pediatrics (Sec I, II)

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This course involves active participation in the care of patients in an ambulatory pediatric practice, including health maintenance, diagnosis and treatment, patient/parent education and follow-up. Course may be used to fulfill requirement of service to a rural (regular tract students only) or medically underserved population.

MPAS 6932 Academic Inpatient Pediatric Medicine

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This course involves active participation as a member of the house-staff pediatric inpatient team in a teaching hospital. Attendance at morning rounds, making case presentations and participating in the night and weekend call schedule are required.

MPAS 6934 Pediatric Elective I - 2 Week Rotation (Sec I- IV)

2.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This Clinical experience involves active participation in a specialty area of pediatric medicine for 2 weeks.

MPAS 6936 Pediatric Elective II - 4 Week Rotation (Sec I-IV)

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This Clinical experience involves active participation in a specialty area of pediatric medicine for 4 weeks.

MPAS 6938 Adolescent Medicine

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This course involves active participation in the care of patients in a clinical setting specializing in adolescent medicine with an emphasis on the medical, psychosocial, developmental, educational and sexual issues that are unique to adolescents.

MPAS 6940 Family Medicine

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This course involves active participation in the care of patients in a family medicine setting, including health maintenance, diagnosis, and treatment, patient education, and follow-up for patients of all ages.

MPAS 6942 Inpatient Adult Medicine

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This course involves active participation as a member of the house staff inpatient team in a teaching hospital. Attendance at morning rounds, making case presentations and participating in the night and weekend call schedule are required.

MPAS 6946 Women's Health I – 2 Week Rotation

2.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This course involves active participation in an obstetrics and gynecology practice. Attendance at deliveries is encouraged and participating in the night and weekend call schedule may be required

MPAS 6947 Women's Health II – 4 Week Rotation

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This course involves active participation in an obstetrics and gynecology practice. Attendance at deliveries is encouraged and participating in the night and weekend call schedule may be required.

MPAS 6948 Emergency Medicine

4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

The course involves active participation in an emergency department. Attendance at meetings, conferences, and participating in the night and weekend call schedule are required.

MPAS 6952 Rural Track Family Medicine (Sec I-II) 4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

This block is comprised of two sections, which must be completed in sequence in a single family medicine practice located in rural Colorado. The sequence involves participation in the care of patients in a family medicine setting, including health maintenance, diagnosis and treatment, patient education and follow-up for patients of all ages.

MPAS 6969 Adult Elective I – 2 Week Rotation (Sec I-IV) 2.0 cr.

The Clinical experience involves active participation in a specialty area of adult medicine for 2 weeks.

MPAS 6970 Adult Elective II – 4 Week Rotation (Sec I-IV) 4.0 cr.

This Clinical experience involves active participation in a specialty area of adult medicine for 4 weeks.

MPAS 6971 Guatemala Clinical Immersion Experience II

T. Fernandez, PA-C

Four-week clinic experience in the country of Guatemala.

MPAS 6972 Guatemala Immersion II for Global Health Track 4.0 cr.

A.Akerman, PA-C

Four-week rotation in the country of Guatemala in fulfillment of Global Health Track requirements.

MPAS 6974 Adult Internal Medicine 4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

The course involves active participation in an internal medicine adult practice in either the outpatient or inpatient setting. Participating in the night and weekend call schedule may be required.

MPAS 6975 Behavioral & Mental Health 4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez,, PA-C

Course involves participation in the care of patients in a behavioral or mental health setting.

MPAS 6980 Third Year Clinical Seminar 2.0 cr.

J. Nieman, PA-C

Third year clinical affords students the opportunity to present a patient encounter using multimedia technology and evidence-based research. This forum will encourage discussion of a vast array of medical conditions.

MPAS 6983 Global Health Track Elective 4.0 cr.

A.Akerman, PA-C

Registration is restricted to those students enrolled in authorized Track. Permission must be given from a CHA/PA Program Associate Director and Course Directors from the SOM Faculty.

MPAS 6987 Urban Underserved Health Track Elective 4.0 cr.

T. Fernandez, PA-C

Registration is restricted to those students enrolled in authorized Track. Permission must be given from a CHA/PA Program Associate Director and Course Directors from the SOM Faculty.

MPAS 6991 CHA/PA Independent Study I – 3rd Year 1.0 cr.

J. Sivahop, PA-C

Approval is required by an Associate Director. This course is offered to those students that are pursuing an independent course of study for 16 hours during the semester they are enrolled.

MPAS 6992 CHA/PA Independent Study II – 3rd Year 2.0 cr.

J. Sivahop, PA-C

Approval is required by an Associate Director. This course is offered to those students that are pursuing an independent course of study for 32 hours during the semester they are enrolled.

MPAS 6993 CHA/PA Independent Study III – 3rd Year 3.0 cr.

Approval is required by an Associate Director. This course is offered to those students that are pursuing an independent course of study for 48 hours during the semester they are enrolled.
