A. Introduction

CU System Administrative Policy Statement (APS) 5060: Faculty Appointments allows emeritus distinction to be granted, upon retirement, to a faculty member with a record of strong contributions to the university.

B. Policy Statement

1. The "emeritus/emerita" title may be awarded after nomination by the primary unit and review and recommendation by the school/college dean or library director and the Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic

and Student Affairs and approval by the Chancellor.

- Retiring faculty may be considered for the emeritus/emerita designation during the academic year of retirement. In exceptional circumstances, an application may be approved by the Chancellor after the faculty member's retirement date. This should only occur when the Chancellor determines the award of emeritus/emerita status is important to the mission of the campus.
- 3. If approved, the designation will be added to the faculty member's title/rank at the time of retirement (e.g. professor emeritus). The effective date may be no earlier than the day following the faculty member's retirement date.
- 4. A retired or retiring faculty member who is not awarded the title of emeritus or emerita shall continue to be eligible for benefits provided to retired faculty.

C. Procedures

 The nomination of a retired or retiring faculty member for emeritus/emerita designation typically originates with the department chair or division head. Nominations are submitted to the school/college dean or library director. A short vita must accompany the nomination. The dean/director, assisted by the dean's review committee, reviews the recommendation, and may forward a positive recommendation and the vita to the executive vice chancellor for academic and student affairs. Upon a positive evaluation, the executive vice chancellor forwards the recommendation and vita to the chancellor. The chancellor notifies the faculty member in writing of their decision, which shall be final.
