CU Denver’s Transferring Undergraduate Policy, though reviewed without revision in June 2018, became contradictory in policy standards with our institutional commitment of excellence in transfer student access and equity. This policy has been revised to reflect campus-wide

effort(s) to update and reform the former CU Denver | Anschutz Medical Campus College of Nursing' transfer policy into a more coherent and relevant set of guidelines. Policy updates including integration of state sponsored (HB20-1002) Prior Learning Agreement, Work-based Learning and revised Veteran Student transferability standards and broadened alignment to include Anschutz Medical Campus. Formatting, language, and additions were updated by the Office of Transfer Initiatives and the Registrar's Office.
