

Did you know...

Assistive technology (AT) is any device or adaptation that helps increase the independence and functioning of a child with disabilities.

AT includes items that help with communication, movement, positioning, play and learning.

AT is one of 15 allowable services in early intervention.

AT can help improve self-esteem, reduce child and adult frustration, and boost independence.

AT in EI is underutilized because of the need for better understanding and awareness.

Many young children who need AT do not receive it until they are at least two years of age.

There is a Colorado loan library of AT devices that is available to any child receiving Part C early intervention services.

Colorado utilizes a network of EI AT consultants across the state who can help with access to the loan library.
