The IFSP Quick Guide

Did you know?

Documentation of assistive technology (AT) on the IFSP is an essential part of providing AT services!

In spite of that fact, only 4% of IFSP's on a national level include documentation of AT services or devices.

Why is it important to document AT on the IFSP?

- It assures the entire IFSP team is on the same page with the AT being used by the child and family, and how, when and where it is being used.
- > It clarifies how the AT helps the child achieve outcomes.
- > It assures delivery and funding of AT services and devices.
- > It assures proper transitioning of AT from EI to public school services.
- It meets federal requirements for documenting AT, which is one of the 15 allowable EI services under IDEA.




Documenting AT on the IFSP can be confusing!!

The <u>IFSP Quick Guide</u> is a web-based tool designed to guide the user through the process of documenting AT on the IFSP. The Quick Guide utilizes a decision tree to assist with determination of whether or not an AT evaluation is required, and with how to document AT services and devices. Navigation can take the seasoned user quickly through the process, or can offer more detailed information and resources through embedded links for those who need more information. It's a great tool with a great purpose!
