CHILD Connections Clinic Caring for High-Risk Infants' Long-Term Development

The CHILD Connections Clinic is a service under the Connections Program for High-risk Infants and Families at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus. The team consists of trained clinicians dedicated to providing high-quality developmental assessment and evidence-based parenting interventions for young children with complex medical histories and/or NICU admissions.



- Developmental evaluations for children at increased risk for developmental-behavioral disorders due to prematurity or complex medical conditions
- Information on how a child is doing developmentally compared to other children their age
- Parenting consultation based on evaluation results
- Parenting support interventions

Who do we serve?

- Children (age 12-42 months) who have experienced one or more of the following:
 - Born <35 weeks and/or with medical complications
 - Hospitalization in first year of life for at least one month
